Individual & Group Services

Individual services partnered a Member and practitioner 1:1 to meet Member goals. Services were provided via technology or in person.

Group services held via technology, in person, or both simultaneously (a hybrid model) safely allowed for maximum Member participation in activities. These services **increased social interactions and expanded learning opportunities for Members**. Scheduled classes included topics such as financial literacy, arts and crafts, health and safety, mental health awareness, and other topics of interest. Regular social hours also occurred.

Group services also provided opportunities for Hedwig House Members to engage in their community by "giving back." Packaging holiday treats and cards for individuals in personal care and nursing facilities as well as get well cards to community members struggling with major medical concerns was an important part of "paying it forward." Additionally, members worked with volunteers on "Day of Service" projects such as cleaning up trash at a local park.

Individual and group services provided essential assistance to Members over 8,200 times.

Staff also provided support to individuals by mailing **1,875 Activity Packets to Members.** Both activities let people know that they were not alone and helped them stay connected to Hedwig House.

This adds up to over **13,000 direct service hours** to members.

Food First Program





Staff, volunteers, and our community partners contributed to our **Food First program**, **ensuring individuals had nutritious meals and food in their pantry**. Each week our staff **delivered home cooked meals** prepared by volunteers as well as donated food from local restaurants. We also **delivered groceries and assisted individuals with their shopping and/or online grocery orders.**

Meals delivered: 7,487

Additional sides and drinks: 2,930

Grocery delivered: 161

These three items helped us deliver a combined total of over 10,000 meals to individuals in

need.

Special Housing Services

Our Special Housing Services ensured that adults with mental illness had a safe and affordable place to call home. Our partnerships with funders and over 50 landlords enabled us to:

- Assist 90 households (114 people) to obtain and maintain housing in their community of choice
- Supply 35 individuals with furniture for their homes
- Assist 32 individuals with financial assistance for security deposits, utility deposits or emergency funds that enabled them to avoid homelessness

Volunteering

43 Volunteers contributing 512 volunteer hours enhanced our Members' lives by preparing meals, providing social opportunities and/or facilitating group activities.

Our **Pen Pal program** allowed volunteers and Members to connect by writing letters or emailing one another.


